



Christ is Born! Glorify Him! $IC \ XC \ NI \ KA$ Glory to Jesus Christ! Glory Forever!

Dear

(say your name right here for your very own personal letter)

"Riiiiip"! That's the sound of the last page of the calendar being ripped off! So far, so good.....Every time I had to write the date on something for this new year, I succeeded in writing 2015! You laugh, but it does take us a while to get used to putting that new date in our brains, especially when we write checks or other important items during these early days of January.

So Happy New Year to you, my Dear One! May God bless you and keep you in the New Year of 2015 that we have just begun. May your journey into the unknown days ahead, be one that is blessed always with the presence of our God as you keep the eyes of your soul fixed firmly on the goal ahead, our destination of Life in Him. One day at a time.....one day at a time! God grant you many happy years!

We are still in the time of the "High Holy Days" of our church, and are definitely still in the time of remembering our loved ones, wherever they are, whether in this life, or already gone before us to life eternal. And I remember <u>you</u> during this special time of Christmas cards and memories and love!

I hope you had a beautiful and blessed Christmas Day, and Christmas Week. Thanks God, everyone was healthy and happy in our house, as well as the rest of the family. A further blessing received was that we got to view Christmas through the eyes of our little ones, here and in Pennsylvania. It is really true that the message of Christmas, to be clearly seen, must be viewed through the eyes of the little children, "for such is the Kingdom of Heaven." Oh the beauty, oh the wonder, oh the excitement! God bless the youngsters for showing us the Christ child and for once again telling us the meaning of Christmas!

It makes me remember my buddy, 'Good ol' Charlie Brown' and the awesome and holy story of

Christmas as told by Charles Shulz. In the cartoon, Charlie becomes increasingly frustrated as he laments the commercialization of Christmas and the non-caring people around him. His struggle builds, until at last he can't take it anymore, and cries out: "Will somebody tell me what Christmas is about?" That prompted Linus, the resident theologian, to take center stage and say this: "And the angel said to them: 'Fear not, for behold, I bring unto you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you this day is born in the City of Bethlehem a Savior, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you: you shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger.' And suddenly there was with the angel, a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God, and saying, 'Glory to God in the highest, and on Earth peace, good will toward men. (Luke 2: 10-15) After reading this gospel narrative, Linus turns to his friend and says, "That's what Christmas is all about, Charlie Brown."

Our church was beautifully adorned with all the special decorations, especially the poinsettias, and it is a very easy place to be able to "lay aside all our earthly cares," and to "lift up our hearts to the Lord." I think I can safely say that Christmas Day Liturgy, and the days following, were all beautiful, prayerful experiences for everyone in the parish. Soon the knock on your door, or the ring of the doorbell, won't be the Fuller Brush Man, or the meter reader, but it will be your priest, carrying the newly blessed Jordan water and asking to be invited to your home to bring the blessing of the Lord to you and yours.

I was pretty good last year, at least I didn't get any coal in my stocking. Thanks to all the St. Nicholases and Santa Clauses for all the special thoughts, prayers and gifts. You are so generous in everything you do for us. God bless you and reward you a hundred fold!

Every gift received was thoughtful, meaningful and useful. I did, however, get one present which will be partly for you as we will be sharing it from time to time during the year. It's called the calendar of

Christ is born! Let us Glorify Him! On this Sunday just after New Year's Day, we are celebrating the Sunday before Theophany: when the time of Bethlehem and Nazareth are drawing to an end. After about thirty years of hidden life, which were made holy by humble work with his hands and by obedience, Jesus is soon to be revealed to the world. In the same way, that in spirit, we went to the manager at Bethlehem, we shall go guided by the angels, toward the river Jordan where our Holy Father will reveal His Son. Not only does our Church associate herself with the joy of the angels who will be present at the baptism of Christ, but Holy Church also invites each of us to draw nearer to the Jordan River, and tells us what it is that we will receive there: "Let us the faithful prepare with just praise for the baptism of our Lord. Behold, He has put on our flesh and asks for the baptism of salvation so that He might regenerate all those who, in purity, have been illuminated by faith; all those who share in His Spirit." These words indicate briefly and precisely the double purpose of the grace which Theophany brings to us. On the one hand, it is our grace for purification and for the remission of sins: on the other hand it is also our grace for illumination and participation in the Holy Spirit. Both the Gospel and Epistle readings for today are devoted to the memory of St. John the Baptist, who at Theophany, itself, is the one who in a way - presented Jesus to the world. The Gospel brings us the austere figure of John, preparing the way, crying in the wilderness, preaching the baptism of repentance, announcing that another will come after him who will baptize us not with water, but with the Holy Spirit. In the Epistle, St. Paul urges his disciple Timothy to watch vigilantly, to endure afflictions, and to do the work of the evangelist, making "full proof of his ministry", which is also the call that the Church addresses to John the Baptist, to accomplish the chief act of his ministry, which is to baptize Jesus and to proclaim to the world: "Behold, the Lamb of God".

Theophany is the appearance of God, where indeed the Holy Trinity manifested itself, after our Lord's baptism in the river Jordan. In this mystery, Christ reveals Himself as the Messiah and Savior. As Christ is baptized, the voice of His Heavenly Father bears witness to the divine mission of Jesus: "You are my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased" (Mark 1:11). The Holy Spirit bears witness

to Christ by descending upon Him in the form of a dove. John the Baptist bears witness as he points to Christ and says: "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world" (John 1:29). God had a plan for mankind. It was for us to grow in knowledge and in wisdom, according to how we could abide it, in purity, without any knowledge of evil at all. But mankind did not choose that plan. So God, in His wisdom and compassion, sent His only-begotten Son. Salvation is the knowledge of God, but only the pure can know the pure. St. Augustine in his sermon on Theophany said: "Today we celebrate the mystery of the Epiphany on earth. Today God, by means of a star in the heavens, heralded his Nativity; and by baptism in the river Jordan, he sanctified water for the renewal of mankind; at a wedding in Cana of Galilee, he changed water into wine; and with five loaves of bread fed five thousand people."

One of the greatest stories ever told is the mystery of the Theophany of our Lord, the self-revelation of God at the Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ in the river Jordan. In this Mystery, Jesus revealed Himself as the Messiah and Savior. Jesus came to the waters of the river Jordan; He stood before John the Baptist, who was uncertain of stretching forth his hands and placing them on the head of Him who sustains all things. On the Holy Day of Theophany, we have an amazing thing before us. He who created the waters submits to being baptized in them. He who created the Heavens and the earth and saw that it was good, He Himself submits to cleansing in waters. He who regenerates our flesh, who is the Regenerator, He descends in the flesh into regenerating waters. And Christ does this to show us how necessary it is to be baptized in the Holy Spirit and cleaned by the waters of grace. To know Christ, we must be like Him. In the Gospel of Matthew 7:20, we read: "Thus by their fruits you will recognize them". Our Christian life in the flesh is to try to acquire the virtues, to acquire the knowledge and grace. to acquire the Holy Spirit, as many have done before us through the fruits of our labors, by fasting, by diligence, by care, by prayers, by repentance, by devotion to God, by the whole Christian life. By His baptism in the Jordan, Jesus sanctified water for the renewal of mankind. The Church blesses water. This is called the great blessing, and in it we read amazing passages from the Old Testament about water and its sanctifying qualities. And then we take this water and use it to sanctify our homes, our souls, and one another.



Christmas Message of His Beatitude Sviatoslav

To Most Reverend Archbishops and Metropolitans, Godloving bishops, reverend clergy, venerable monastics, beloved brothers and sisters in Ukraine and in the diaspora.

Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord. (Luke 2:10-11)

Christ is born!

It is with these words of the heavenly messenger that the Church of Christ announces the news of salvation. Today the Savior is born to us; the Lord came down to earth and appeared in the flesh in the town of Bethlehem. Heaven and earth exult today, and the whole of humanity is filled with gladness for our Creator did not abandon His creation, but came to share in its destiny. He became man to share in man's life: in its pains and joys, tribulations and uncertainties. The Lord becomes one of us, He manifests Himself as our Savior and Redeemer.

During the feast of Christ's Nativity we are rejoicing because we no longer feel abandoned or alienated; we are celebrating the fact that God is with us, that He loves us. We see the love of God incarnate in the newborn child Jesus, sleeping tenderly on the hay in a manger. The mystery of the Nativity of our Savior makes manifest for us the truth about the powerful divine nature appearing in the weak human one, about small and trivial human affairs transcending themselves to become great in God.

The Holy Gospel tells us that the Lord of the Universe was born to a family of refugees. At first, because of Caesar's decree, and then due to the tyranny of King Herod, the Holy Family had to abandon its home and ask others for help. Our God deemed it worthy to be born as a refugee and homeless. In these circumstances, only the Wise men from the East as well as all those who were not

ashamed of being close to the needy, refugees or the persecuted, had the privilege of being near the Divine Child. Those people opened to Him the doors of their hearts, of their homes, saw the sign of salvation in the Lord born in a manger and, as a result, they were filled with the divine joy in the dark of the night. The Mystery of Christmas is the capacity to be in God's presence and to encounter the newly born Christ through the ability of being close to those who are weak and defenseless, who suffer from cold and the lack of bare necessities.

Ukraine lived through a strange year, in which everything was bigger than life, be it hope or desolation, certainty or despair, gain or loss. The fear was also immense, the fear sent by Darkness that saw our victorious ascent unto the Light. The darkness, then, sent us pain and blood, wounds and even death in the hope that the people would be terrified of this suffering and return to the old road of silent and unquestioning subordination.

There is no Ukrainian who did not participate in this trial of Divine Providence that continues to this day. In a way, all of us are in a zone of risk, in the zone of the anti-terrorist operation (ATO). Just like those shepherds who, in their pastures heard the heavenly choirs of angels and received the news of the Savior's birth, we also have our own place of spiritual vigil, our own "security checkpoint" for our Christian and civilian mission. And even if one becomes tired and wants to escape, he is still working. In this case, however, by his passivity he gives evil a helping hand.

Our road to Christmas this year was the road to the wounded, to the forsaken. In a very literal sense, our Church became a field hospital erected to be a haven for the persecuted and healing for the injured. And even after Maidan, the Church remained that hospital, for it is her duty to be so. Pope Francis also says, "I see the church as a field hospital after the battle."

No one was prepared for this war, but the war continues and has an effect on every Ukrainian family, especially in the east of the country. There is the

danger of lessening our sensitivity towards misery and suffering of our fellow men. The Christian knows that indifference kills no less than "Grad" rockets. It is the duty of the government to resolve in a wise manner the obligation to help its suffering citizens. And it is the duty of us Christians to be near to those who are in distress. It is this Christian unity with the needy, this solidarity that makes us stronger. Through it the power of the God incarnate, the work of the Savior born to free us and make us invincible in God, is manifest and given to us.

At Christmas time, every one of us looks up to heaven hoping to see the light of the Bethlehem star. The New Year is not promising to become any easier, neither our choices any simpler. Our most important task for the year 2015 is to be on our way towards a civilized and dignified life. To achieve this we all must put on the new man, the man of God, in other words, we have to abandon all unworthy themselves completely unimportant. This task of and Savior and rejoices in Christ's Nativity. moving towards good is also important from the every Ukrainian is changed - the country will be changed also. All of us share the responsibility of clothing our nation with effective governmental structures that will no longer be structures of sin. The government can indeed be a blessing, if it starts serving people.

Both of these tasks cannot be achieved realistically without at least once experiencing feelings of doubt, or without error, or without taking a step backwards. Let not our pride fool us into thinking we are perfect; it is better to acknowledge our failings before God and humbly ask, "O God, help my powerlessness." The humble do not lose faith in their abilities, for, as Ivan Franko writes, they "feel the Lord's hand on their shoulders." Let us remember, therefore, that despair, disappointment or the desire to exact revenge on those who disappointed us - these are the instruments used very effectively by the Darkness to strengthen its

lost power. Let us not help the Darkness ruin our chances. Defeat lies not in that we have unsuccessful in accomplishing everything we wanted to, but in not doing anything at all.

We also have another task, without a doubt. It is our task to pray. The Maidan overcame the odds because people there prayed sincerely. Let us not let our "adaptation" to living in a time of war lessen the intensity of our prayers. Let us do everything in our power so that our prayer for Ukraine continue in our families and communities, so that in our country, as in the poor manger of Bethlehem, would shine the light of faith, so that our hearts may be purified, and a new life continue to grow. Only then, through God's grace, may we become the most fortunate nation on earth.

Through the dark night of uncertainties and worries, the ancestral carol is heard, dispelling every sorrow and misfortune. With this Good News of compromises with the evil one. This is the task of Christmas, I desire to visit every home of every each and every one of us, even those who think person of good will who accepts the newly born God

We send today our Christmas greetings to our point of view of responsible citizenship, because if soldiers who will spend this holiday in cold trenches and bunkers in the front line and who are ready to sacrifice themselves for their people. Our festive greetings and wishes of everything good go to those who have lost their home and their family.

> With the singing of the angels of peace on earth and glory in the highest, let us visit those who are grieving for their loss of relatives and friends, who are suffering from injuries, who are taken prisoner. Because during this Christmas night happiness wins over sadness, and the heavenly light outshines the dark, may our Savior fill us this Christmas with the power to conquer evil with good, falsehood with truth, and may the peace from heaven be triumphant over war.
