

## From the desk of Fr. Ray Palko

Glory to Jesus Christ! Glory Forever! Dear

(Your name here, for your very own personal letter)

First of all, I've got to tell you that "OI' Mr. Mac" is no longer with us. He went out as we expected, making a lot of noise, whirring and clunking. He's been sent on to the recycling bin, where hopefully, he will become part of a new and better machine one day. It was very sad to see him go, but now we are already trying to get familiar with his replacement. Everything is new and different, so getting used to it all is going to be a great adventure, I'm sure! In case you aren't aware, this electronic stuff, or any machines for that matter, are not "my cup of tea." You should be honored because your letter is the very first job that I've attempted with the new computer.

I hope this machine will be as good and strong as the first. We had that one for nine years! I understand that's 'crazy old' for these new-fangled gadgets. It was cute to see the reaction of the "nerds" in the Apple Store when we would tell them what we had. It was, "Okaaay, we'll see what we can do about it," they would say. Actually, the last time we had it in the shop for help/repairs, they told us it was really on the way out. Because of their kindness and expertise, we managed to squeeze another whole year out of it. So here we go off to the races.....

Do you remember the movie or play "Fiddler on the Roof?" Remember that line when one of the villagers posed a question to the old Rabbi? "Rabbi, is there a blessing for the Tsar?" And he replied, "Oh yes, there is a blessing for everything, even the Tsar!"

Did you ever wonder if there is a blessing for a computer? My answer to that is like the Rabbi's, "There is a blessing for everything!" As a matter of fact, when the priest comes to bless your home, or if he just comes to visit, you should ask Father to

bless your computer(s). The computer and all the other new "social media" are wonderful instruments when used correctly, but they can also become cesspools of filth, and a gateway for the evil one to enter our homes. We need to really be cautious about the power and the content of these things, and beginning with a blessing is a wonderful and pious idea. And not only for the new unit, but how about every time we sit down and turn the thing on. We can and should say a simple prayer such as, "O Lord, come and be with us, bless this our work, keep us from the Evil One and all his cunning ways." Or this one, "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the Evil One. Amen."

As Catholics, we continue to watch and wait for further news about Pope Benedict and the soon to be called conclave to elect his successor. The Holy Father and the Bishops of the Vatican are on retreat this week so it's been quiet, but he is expected to make his last appearance for the noon *Angelus* on February 24. Last week when he was on the balcony, there was a crowd of over 15, 000 in St. Peter's Square. On a normal Sunday the crowd is usually about five thousand. No doubt there will be a record crowd for this final appearance. Definitely a story in the making, and definitely to be continued.

I think here about the local TV and radio news and weather people, who almost become part of our family, as we invite them into our homes each day. They don't know us, and we don't know them, but we feel good in our familiarity with them as they become part of the routine of our lives.

There a number of people like that as we go about our day to day activities. One special person, also who was on television, was like that. We didn't know him, and he didn't know us, yet he was part of our lives through the connection of the EWTN television network. Here I'm speaking of Deacon William Steltelmaier, well-known from that station, and who reposed earlier this week. I've got to admit, sometimes his southern accent, especially when he



read Latin, was like fingernails on a chalkboard. However, he was EXTREMELY influential, along with Mother Angelica, of making the call for that Catholic network a reality. He was EXTREMELY influential in our spiritual life as we watched and listened to him.

We are supposed to imitate the saints as a way of growing in our spiritual lives. When we say that, we of course, think of the million dollar saints. St. Paul used to call all the members of the Church "saints." They are the ones who heard the Gospel, lived it, and acted on it. I'm not in the business of canonizing saints, but I think "Deacon Bill" was one of these "ordinary" saints living among us.

Besides his expertise as a lawyer, he was a devout Catholic who heard the Gospel, lived it and acted on it. He is someone who is a wonderful example for us to imitate. No, we certainly don't have to talk like him, but we surely can strive to be like him in his love for the Church and for each other. We'll miss him not being there on television from time to time. His work is now finished and I'm sure he has already heard those longed for words of our Lord, "Well done good and faithful servant! Enter into the Kingdom prepared for you." May he rest in Peace. May we follow his good and kind example of love.

Thanks to all who kept us, and our dear little Emma, in your prayers last week. The surgery on her ears and adenoids went perfectly and she continues to get back 100 per cent to her old self.

These are the days when it is actually a joy to see her "fighting" with her brother and/or sister! Yes! She's getting better! Surgery for anybody is scary, but when it's a little one like that, it is a real occasion to storm heaven with our prayers. Thanks and glory to God for the good outcome!

All is well in our house and we pray you, too, are well, and are walking closely with the Lord

and His holy ones, as we progress through these God-given, and God blessed days of the Great Fast. As you read this, it will be the second Sunday of this spiritual journey. Do you know that those who pray according to the Julian (o.s.) calendar have not even begun yet? Yikes, Sunday the 17<sup>th</sup> was only "Zaccheus Sunday" for them, so the first day of their Fast will be March 18, which will be the last week for us prior to Holy Week and Pascha. From "Good Samaritan" Ukr. Radio pr. When I look in between the lines of today's Gospel reading, I see a man who was given a second chance. A man who was brought before Jesus to be healed, but received so much more, when Jesus reached out to him and forgave him his sins. Life is not full of many second chances, but every day, we have an amazing opportunity to ask our Lord for forgiveness. We have a chance to wipe the slate of our iniquity clean, and move on in our lives with profound thanks and gratitude. And maybe we even rejoice a little bit more in that message of forgiveness, knowing that we can be saved. This opportunity for second chances reminds me of a man, named Daniel, whom I met a good many years ago, while I was an undergraduate student at SUNY Fredonia. They did not have a Ukrainian parish in the area, so I attended the Newman Center: a catholic place of worship which is still found on most campuses these days. It was there that I met Daniel. It was my sophomore year and I really enjoyed singing in the campus church choir. I noticed Daniel right away, because he often sat alone, I think that people were taken back by his form of rejoicing. You see, whenever the choir would sing those wonderful catholic hymns, Daniel would join us in voice while he joyfully danced his personal hymn of praise. For months, he remained the object of discussion, until finally one day I decided to get to know him a little better. I invited him to the campus for coffee, and was amazed with his story. Daniel told me how he grew up in an area with a lot of crime and violence. Both his parents neglected him, and his grandfather was the only one who kept him on the straight path. Daniel would go to church with his grandfather and have wonderful discussions with him, until three weeks after Daniel's 12th birthday, when his grandfather died suddenly from a heart attack. Daniel told me that it nearly broke him inside, and how there was no longer any good influence in his life. So he turned to the company of gangs and drug dealers on the streets, getting involved in robbery and drugs at the age of 13, until

one day he was so doped up on heroine that he shot and killed another boy just walking across the street. Daniel was sentenced to juvenile detention until his 18th birthday and then he was expected to serve the remainder of his sentence in an adult correction facility, doing hard time! He told me how birthdays became a horrible reminder of his age, because he knew that once he turned 18, things were going to get even harder for him in prison. The day Daniel appeared before the court, he expected the worst. But you could see his eyes light up when he told me that everyone in that court room seemed to look at him differently. He told me how flabbergasted he was when the judge actually suggested showing him mercy and having Daniel released on parole. He didn't understand, so he turned and asked his lawyer who told him that the judge received a letter from the grandmother of the boy that he killed, requesting that Daniel be released and that they show him mercy, because she has already forgiven him for taking the life of her grandson. "Forgiveness", Daniel said with tears in his eyes, "is the reason I come to church every week and joyfully rejoice in the Lord, because that forgiveness was my second chance to become a better man. A man that my grandfather would have been proud of - and I thank Jesus every day for the gift of His saving grace".

I often wonder, while we are in Church and in God's presence, what are the things that keep us from reaching out to Jesus? What prevents us from the joyful dance of reconciliation with God and that spiritual rejoicing after we accept the sacrament of forgiveness? At times we may feel as though our soul is paralyzed, just like the paralytic man's body. We are unable to do the good that we know we should do and that we even long to do, because our sinful habits inhibit us. We stand before Christ, but find it difficult to admit our need for forgiveness and a second chance. But have no fear – the Lord is always reaching out to us. Jesus embodied faith -He was a man of reflection and action. ...



She was a very hard working woman and held many jobs, including Bemis Bag Company, Buffalo General Hospital, Curbell Plastics and Trico Products.

God always came first in Kataryna's life. She went on numerous religious retreats, always prayed for everyone and instilled those values in her children. She was also very proud of her Ukrainian heritage and loved to cook traditional Ukrainian meals. These traditions have been passed down to her children and grandchildren and will live on forever. Kataryna was a devoted wife and mother who always put her family before herself. She was a very kind-hearted, loving, car-

ing and giving person. She was very generous and always made everyone feel loved and at home in her presence. She went out of her way to visit the lonely and sick, often bringing flowers and always sent cards!! Her "Florida daughter" (Denyse Burton Seibel) says that she felt that her troubles were lessened, her days were much brighter and she had renewed strength after a talk and some hugs from mama Nyznyk !

Kataryna loved and cared for all of God's creatures, loved flowers and was at home in the garden...

Over the years she had many dogs and cats always made sure she fed the birds. She even rescued some baby birds that had fallen from their nests.

Kataryna always said that she will embrace the day when she will be reunited with her beloved Father in Heaven, her Mama, Tato, brothers and sisters, husband and son Ewhen. It is truly heartwarming to envision such a reunion!!
