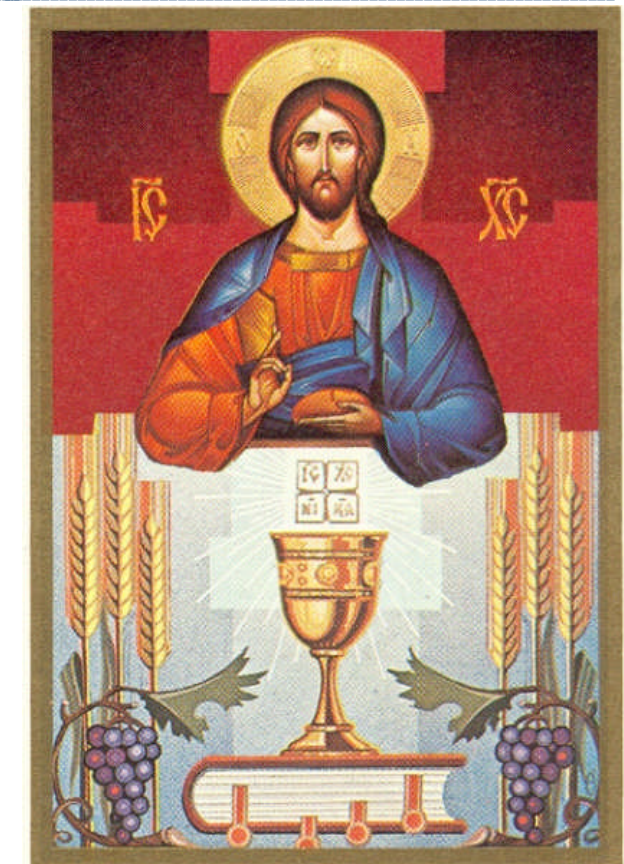



Dr. "Bo" has been a guest speaker for various organizations including the Amherst School System and Fidelis Healthcare. "Life is a celebration," says the upbeat practitioner who still makes house calls, trying his best to create a warm, reassuring environment that puts patients and their families at ease. "If we can help children grow up to be healthy and happy, then we are doing the right thing." Dr. "Bo" has been a pediatrician for more than 20 years, having worked as a pediatric specialist in the emergency room at Children's Hospital, as a former practitioner at Sheridan Pediatrics, and now in his own practice, Holiday Pediatrics, where they treat every child "one dream at a time".

Perhaps you are an expectant mom, dad, or even grandparent and you have concerns regarding pregnancy, prenatal care, delivery, or postnatal care issues. Maybe you are just wondering how to keep your children healthy during the flu and cold season, or you have concerns about vaccinations or other types of therapy and treatment options. As parents we have a plethora of questions and concerns regarding what is best for our children, so if you are wondering what local pediatricians have to offer, or if you just want to come and bring your children as you listen and talk



with Dr. "Bo", then please mark your calendars and plan on attending this free and informative event being held on July 21st. З радія "Милосердний Самарянин"

У сьогоднішньому євангельському читанні чули ми про чоловіка який 38 років пролижав хворим, і яким здається ніхто не цікавився. Згідно з традицією була в Єрусалемі чудотворна купіль, що називалася Ветезда (Овеча купіль), і час до час Ангел Господній приходив і порушав воду, і хто перший зійшов би до тієї води, ставав би здоровим. Цей хворий чекав на порушення води, але поки він доповзав би, інші вже перед ним сходили, і так для нього не було можливості одержати оздоровлення. Все ж таки він терпеливо надіявся хоч і без надії. І приходив Христос, і питається його: "Хочеш бути здоровим?" Що за питання. Та він тільки цього одного бажав.

І дивно якось виглядають нам слова розслабленого, який не відповідає на Христовий запит, але починає нарікати кажучи: "Господи, не маю нікого, хто б мене спустив у купіль, коли ото вода зрушиться: бо ось тільки я прийду, вже інший переді мною поринає."

"Немаю нікого." Страшне обвинувачення. Розслаблений чується усіма залишений, ніхто ним не цікавиться, ніхто не подасть руку допомоги, ніхто теплого слова до нього не проговорить.

Як він нагадує нам старших, хворих, опущених, бездомних. Кілько з них мають своїх дітей, які одначе ними не цікавляться, кілько молодших приятелів, що про них забули, а колись з ними разом працювали, і в церкву, і на різні засідання ходили.

Існує приповідка що одна мати може виховати понад десятеро дітей, але де-

сятиро дітей почасти не можуть як слід заопікуватися одною немічною мамою.

Нераз шукаємо вигод і нам хвороба чи старість інших не по дорозі. Не маємо для них часу, і не думаємо про це кілько вони опікувалися нами, коли ми були маленькими або хворими або у якій небудь потребі.

У стихирах вечірні сьогоднішньої неділі ми так читаємо: "Коли побачив тебе розслаблений, отой непохований померлий, кликнув: Помилуй мене, Господи, бо постіль стала мені гробом! І навіщо ж мені жити? Не потребую Овечої купелі, бо не маю нікого, хто б поклав мене в неї, коли заворушується вода." А інша стихира додає: "Змилиувався спас та й каже до нього: Задля тебе я став людиною, заради тебе я воплотився, а ти кажеш – людини не маю. Візьми твою постіль і ходи!"

Ми також, до певної міри розслаблені. У нас різні фізичні хвороби, але ще може більші – душевні.

Хвороба є не бачити потребу ближнього, не чути їхнього зойку, не прийти їм на допомогу, не сказати доброго слова потіхи чи поради. Хвороба є журитися тільки собою, допомагати тільки собі, обнімати тільки себе.

Просім Господа, щоб приніс нам оздоровлення, щоб ми побачили і почули і зрозуміли. Щоб також і ми стали Христом для інших, подібно як інші, що нам допомагають у який небудь спосіб, стали Христом для нас...

Помолімся за хворих і немічних і тих, якими ніхто не цікавиться!!!

Certainly no complaints about weather today. WOW! What a gorgeous, beautiful day we are having! It's Wednesday afternoon (May 11, the 131st day of the year with 234 days left in the year). I just got back home to West Seneca after serving our noon Liturgy in "The Falls" and a Eucharistic visit to a real nice homebound lady, who greatly delights in the reception of Holy Communion. Today is the first real "salubrious" day of this year. Not only have those long awaited spring flowers and trees exploded into blankets of color everywhere, but the people too, have exploded out of hibernation. What a nice day it is! Flowers, green leaves, people, kids, motorcycles, boats on the river-I'd say that spring has finally arrived!! Or as they say in Schuylkill County, PA: "Hoodie Hoo!" Glory to God for these abundant blessings, known and unknown!

Presbytera Laryssa and Fr. Eli's two, Jonah and Nathanael, live 5 hours away so we get to see them about every six weeks or so. Of course we often talk on the phone...gotta get us one of those new-fangled computer hook-ups so we can see each other while we talk. Anyway Jonah is doing more than great in Kindergarten, and loving every minute of it.

He's a kid who moans and groans when he can't go to school. Don't tell his classmates, but he'd go everyday, if he could. Hope it keeps up, right? His little brother Nathanael is still "a stay at home kid" except for some time in daycare so his parents can accomplish their jobs and responsibilities. Thanks God they are healthy and are big helpers in the Church before, during and after the services. Jonah is his Dad's right hand man and is going to be a number one altar server. Nathanael helps to pull the big rope that rings the steeple bells, and he's gonna be right there with his brother soon.

The other part of our family, the Martelli's, last week moved from Amherst to West Seneca. How great is that! From 18 miles away to 4... how great is that! Of course we saw them often before, but now we can visit just about everyday. How great is that! ☺ Emma, Noah and Natalia also are beautiful, healthy and growing nicely. You should here them sing, and I can tell you here and now that Noah can swing a kadylo better than a lot of priests I know. His Mom made him a "kadylo" by using a small sock into which she put 3 small jingle bells and tied it closed with a long piece of material. For Noah it's the real thing. He "censes" anything that moves when he's in action. ☺ ☺

They are such a joy to have at our Liturgies in Niagara Falls! They are attentive to the service, sing out loud and clear, come to the Gospel, venerate icons, can't wait for "Bozhey Bread" at Communion and in general, are always praying the Liturgy. Sometimes I suppose,

they get a little loud and perhaps can be a bit of a distraction to those in the pews, but they are so filled with Divine Life it is an absolute joy to have them there. Talk about singing and praying from the heart...they do it! I recently heard about a woman who was beaten by her father and sought refuge in a shelter. There, she received business attire and matching shoes to get the best job she had ever had in her life. She works hard, gets her own home and saves money. She is now the owner of a restaurant and helps pick up donations for the same women's shelter so that others can benefit from the same help she once received. Many of us throw out clothing that we clean from our closets, but it would be just as easy to drop those clothes off at a donation box so people in need can have them. Many churches provide donation bins for clothing, so people can drop off an item or two on their way to Sunday services. I meant a young woman a few weeks ago, who lost her husband and was raising three children on her own. Just months ago, she did not have enough money to feed her family and she needed to find a job. The young mother went to a food pantry and applied for aid. She was able to secure groceries and food for her family, and volunteers at the pantry even helped her find a job. Now this young woman volunteers to package and sort goods for other families in need of food. There are food pantries in every city that accept food donations daily. They pick up donations inside area grocery stores to supply the needy and we only need to drop an item or two into the food barrel to help. On a much larger scale, consider what is happening to families throughout the Midwest that have lost everything to natural disasters. The Red Cross is constantly accepting donations to accommodate so many in need. When those tornadoes struck, lives were lost, homes and even communities were destroyed, and people were left homeless; trying to piece together what little they have left. This is when neighbors who do not even know each other band together to help one another. They sort through the rubble, make emergency repairs, and share sources of food with each other. The elderly are helped by complete strangers to a safe environment, and trips to

receive emergency food and water are organized in a network of people who are all pulling together to make the best of a bad situation. Many times a simple gesture of goodwill toward another human being who is in need of help will give them the courage to thrive. Most people who really appreciate the help they are given will give back to the community as soon as they can. And when I read about the man in today's Gospel, who for 38 years was abandoned and cast aside, until Jesus asked him if he wanted to be healed, I pray that had we been there – any one of us would have stopped to help him.

Truthfully, there are people in need all around us. Do we offer them the chance to be well? Do we welcome them in our lives, into our circle of friends, in our Churches and among our communities? What message has Christ given us in today Gospel reading? Not only did Jesus not withhold Himself from anyone; He intentionally sought out the deserted, the helpless, the outcast, the poor, and the lame. Christ died for your sins and He died for my sins; He died for the sins of all humanity. Christ came to earth with a mission; He came to bring salvation to the world. Sometimes, we lose sight of our own purpose here on earth, because unlike Christ, we are not born with an awareness of our mission. So we live by the example and teaching of Christ in order to find our purpose and meaning, and we are given the gift of the Holy Spirit to guide us in our daily actions. No matter how many years we are given in this lifetime here on Earth, we can all be certain of one very important and amazing detail: Jesus loves us with a love that we cannot even begin to comprehend. And this love of the Lord enables us to share his compassion and goodwill with one another. This must be our faith, our conviction, and our message of reconciliation for the whole world – because Jesus is among His faithful, every day, still actively touching lives in amazing ways. The Savior of the world is here, and He has come with the power and the glory of His Resurrection...
