5, 2011 at St. Mary's Hospital at Amsterdam, NY, surrounded by her loving family.



Greetings from the awesome and gorgeous Catskill Mountains, on a very beautiful, late-spring morning. The first scheduled event for today (Tuesday June 7), our morning prayer, was completed a few minutes ago. It is about 7:45am and I thought I'd at least begin your letter in these few minutes between now, and our oatmeal and scrambled eggs, which will be served beginning at 8am. Actually, they always offer us a lot more than that. Usually

Usually it's a real "Farmer's Breakfast" buffet featuring eggs, pancakes or French toast, all kinds of cereal, yogurt, breads, coffee, juice, etc., etc. Hey this is a Ukie place and nobody ever leaves Baba's house hungry. © So in few minutes it's off to breakfast and then the rest of our day.

Most of the Fathers are here, but as always, I've noticed a few of them didn't make it. Understandably, there are always individual circumstances preventing several of them from being able to attend. Topping that list, of course, would be because of funerals and illness, while others are away studying, still working as teachers, or on a vacation somewhere. We are required to attend these gatherings, so if one cannot make it, he must be excused by the Bishop. Of course Vladyka is always gracious and understanding about that. He knows that if you can't make it, you can't make it. No problem.

I've also noticed several new faces among us and I suspect they are deacons who have been invited to attend this session. Normally, these gatherings have only been for priests, but I think from now on the Deacons will continue to be invited. And that is a VERY GOOD THING! The deacons in our parishes

are right up there with the pyrohy ladies, and the people who care for our churches and property as real unsung heroes. They are constantly serving in their quiet way and just loving the church. My dream and prayer is for our parish in Niagara Falls someday to be blessed by the continuous service of a deacon. Anyone? Anyone?

I'm sure you have heard of most of these priests and deacons, and hopefully you will even send a card to those you know, or who might have touched your life. We send our prayers, love and thanks to all of these Jubilarians as we thank them for their service and wish them "Many Years!" It's quite a crew, huh?!

OK, the above was all the writing I completed at Soyuzivka. We made it back home safe and sound after a very interesting and beneficial program. We 'hit the road' on Wednesday afternoon and arrived home around 10:30pm. The trip was pleasant and

uneventful, except for about a two-mile stretch when we had to pass through a strong thunderstorm that, in additon to the rain, was dropping hail. It was nice to pull out of that and into the western sunshine of a late afternoon. No rainbows this time, however.

I don't know if you know anything about

the Armenians and/or their Liturgy, but I must tell vou I was fascinated with the presentation of Fr. Daniel Findikyan, a professor at their seminary in New Rochelle, CT. As he spoke, we, of the **Byzantine Tradition and** from our Ukrainian perspective, realized how much we had in common with Armenian Orthodox. both in our history and liturgical life. Even though the presenter was Orthodox, we were truly together as brothers, and

quickly realized how close we truly are. First of all the plight of the Armenians is very similar to Ukrainians in that it seemed as if there was always somebody trampling the country. If it wasn't the Greeks, it was the Turks, or Mongols, or somebody. So, like Ukrainians, they are a suffering people, but a people full of hope and strength. Their Liturgy has much the same structure as ours, but is very, very different when it is celebrated. There is too much about them to write here, but I know I for one, want to know more about Armenia, especially the Liturgy, icons and sacraments. It was very good to be there and hear about our brothers and sisters of that church. They aren't in every city, but if you ever have a chance to attend their Liturgy or some cultural event, don't hesitate to do so. I know I'll jump at the first opportunity to join them

first chance I get. It was another very good conference and I was glad to be able to attend.

These days after our conferences are "catch up" days after being away like that, and the weekend is here before you know it. This Sunday we will be celebrating the

great feast of Pentecost. Hope you like

We left the hot, steamy weather downstate, and now are enjoying some very pleasant days here. The lawnmowers are chugging away and more and more flowers are appearing in

I'm glad to be back to "Home Sweet Home" and I'm going to close now and go do some of my "catch up" stuff. "May the Holy Spirit come upon you, and the power of the Most High overshadow you!" May the Most Holy Theotokos protect you and keep you!

During WWII, the Japanese took prisoner a company of soldiers. For a long time the prisoners lived in a state of hatred and

resentment toward each other as well as their captors. They lived like animals, stealing food from one another, and letting the sick and the starving die. God had no part in their lives. One day a Japanese officer lined them all up and reported that a shovel was missing. The guilty man was asked to step forward and identify himself and admit his theft of the shovel. No one stepped forward. Then the officer threatened to shoot all of them if the guilty one did not

speak up. There was no response. So the officer prepared to start killing prisoners until the guilty one spoke. Just then one man stepped forward. The rest of the men were dismissed and the prisoner was taken away and tortured to death. A few days later it was learned that one of the Japanese guards had miscounted and that there was no missing shovel. Then it was finally realized by the other prisoners that the man had stepped forward only to protect the others from harm and had died to save their lives. This caused the whole atmosphere in the prison camp to change. Now they began to love and care for each other. Their relationship with God started to mean something to them. Many turned to Christ and started reading the Bible. One of the prisoners was inspired because of this to enter the seminary after the war. It all started when one man decided to follow the example of Christ, to listen to the urging of the Holy Spirit and sacrifice his life to save his comrades. The words of Jesus spring to mind, "Greater love has no man than to give his life for his friends."

We are not God - not any of us - but Pentecost serves to remind us that we are a part of God, members of His Body - the Church. When we follow Jesus and consecrate our life

to Him, as did the original twelve disciples, something wonderful happens. We begin to feel the presence of God within us through the impulse of the Holy Spirit - which empowers our faith and transforms us into a people of God - a holy people of faith. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are truly numerous and great. St. Paul speaks of them in his letter to the Galatians: "But the fruit of the Spirit is charity and joy, peace and patience, kindness and goodness,

faith, modesty, and continence" (Galatians 5: 22-23). St. John Chrysostom in his homily on the feast of Pentecost wrote: "The all gracious God today bestowed upon us gifts, too great to be adequately expressed in words. Therefore, let us all rejoice together, and while rejoicing, let us praise our God. For I ask, what was given to us for our salvation that was not given to us by the Holy Spirit? The Holy Spirit freed us from slavery, adopted and called us to the freedom of the children of God. From this fountain flows prophecies, the grace of healing, and all the other gifts and fruits with which the Church is able to adorn itself." My brothers and sisters, through the Holy Spirit, we are able to call God, Father; we are able to become partakers of the grace of Jesus Christ, to be called the sons and daughters of light, and to share in His everlasting glory. As children of light, we have found the true light, and we worship the undivided Trinity for having saved us.

...Holy Spirit, working its grace through the soul is what changes our lives for the better.
